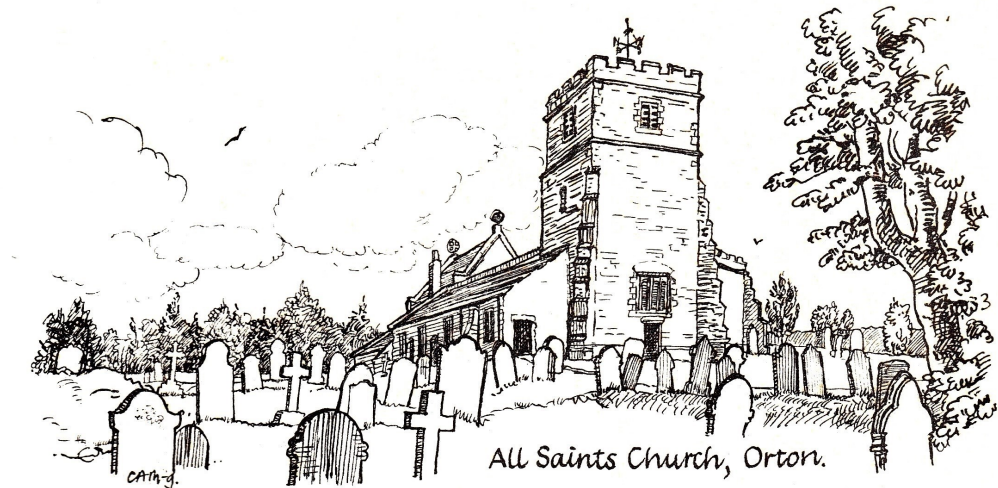

A thought from the Curate

Hello everyone. It is a pleasure to introduce myself as the Assistant Curate and to be able to address you through the Link.

Many Christians today do not pray, and this is something that is true of both laity and clergy. The cause is a mystery.

“For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer.” (1 Peter 3: 12 NRSV)

We live in a very noisy world. To get someone’s attention is no easy task. They must be willing to set everything aside to listen: turn down the radio, turn away from the television, computer screen or put the book to one side. When someone is willing to silence everything else so they can hear us clearly, it is a privilege. A rare privilege indeed.

Our prayers are honoured in heaven as precious to God. Purified and empowered, the words rise to our Lord..... our words do not stop until they reach the throne of God and God listens to each and every prayer. Prayer is our communication with God; our personal prayers, prayers for others and our intercessions. We can pray wherever we are – in the kitchen as we cook or clean or in the car as we drive along the motorway. God is listening to our prayers. Sometimes I ‘chat’ to God as I am in prayer – this is acceptable as God is listening to our ideas, thoughts and petitions within our prayer and conversations with Him. Sometimes our prayer is very focused as we have a specific petition perhaps.

Our prayers on earth activate God’s power in heaven, and God’s will is done on earth as it is in heaven.

Our prayers move God to change the world. We may not understand the mystery of prayer and we don’t need to. But this is clear: Actions in

heaven begin when someone prays on earth.

PRAY and then -

Be still and aware of God’s presence within and all around.

“Be still and know that I am God.” (Psalm 46: 10 NRSV)

Let us pray for one another and let us not forget to thank God in our prayers. It is very easy to forget that God,

“...so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.” (John 3: 16 NRSV)

I think we have a lot to thank God for in our prayer, don’t you?

Remembering Road Crash Victims: A Service in Carlisle Cathedral on Sunday 17th November at 3pm

The record of injury and deaths in road traffic collisions in Cumbria is a serious one. In recent years more than 30 people have been killed annually in road crashes in our county.

This service will allow us to remember those killed and injured, together with their families and friends. We will also acknowledge the careful work and costly dedication shown by all those involved in the aftermath of a crash – including fire, police and ambulance personnel, doctors, nurses and counsellors. Prayers will be said for all those who have been killed or injured on our roads.

Those attending the service will be invited to write the names of those they wish to be remembered on a paper Oak Leaf. The Leaves will be carried to the altar and laid in the sanctuary as part of an act of remembrance. Canon Jan Kearton, the Canon Warden at Carlisle Cathedral, will be the preacher.

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**Notes from The Herald,
November 1913**

Mixed weather in first half, wet
second half; chilly.

Orton’s two springs at Scarside failed
in this summer’s drought (July), the
RDC noted. They are to try Bullflatt’s
spring. Wanted for Orton Parochial
School a female assistant teacher
(uncertificated) and another for Tebay
Endowed School. Both are now run
by the County Education Committee,
Kendal. Orton, Tebay, Greenholme
and Newbiggin on Lune Primitive
Methodist Chapels are in Brough PM
Circuit and held a missionary meeting
each 16th – 22nd November. Died at
Orton, on 12th, Rachel Little aged 80.

Tebay’s Chief Railway Telegraph
Clerk, Mr. F.W. Ball, 1 Woodend
Terrace, died there on Tues morning,
28th October. He was aged 55. He
was active in Tebay Church, Bible
Society and CEMS (Secretary). He
was hale and hearty till his collapse
that night in bed. He was about to
take up promotion in Lancaster. A
great shock for Tebay. Tebay’s Mr.
Thomas Fazackerley, recently
promoted to Workington as loco
foreman lost his wife on 24th October.
The funeral was on Monday 27th
October at Upperby, Carlisle. Their
youngest daughter, Miss Mary, is
Head of Tebay Infants School.
Tebay’s Stationmaster Mr. W.A.
Mellor, 6 years here, was promoted to
Stechford Station and handed over to
his successor on Wed. 5th, Mr.
Hardsley. Mr. Hardsley was Night
Stationmaster at Holyhead till then.
The Tebay branch of the N.U.R. has
sent £4.16s.0d (£380 now) to help the
Dublin workers.

The LNWR has strung the RDC along
since 1895 as to the footbridge wanted
at Low Lane and they are now to
complain to the Board of Trade,
London. The LNWR never answers
their letters on this. They last tried in
1911 too.

On Monday, 17th at 10.40p.m. the
Sunday papers vendor in Woodend
Terrace had a crowd at his door
shouting at him. Culprits in Court.
Also two drunks at Mount Pleasant on
18th October and three Tebay lads up
for salmon poaching on 9th November.
Fining them, the Court said “Your
story is a load of cock and bull”. The
debut of Tebay Assembly Hall’s new
piano (played by Miss Hayworth) was

at its annual Concert and Potato Pie
Supper (over 20 large pies made by
Mr. T. Longmire). It made £4.17s.4d
for the piano fund.

Visit of ex-President of PM
Conference and Superintendent of the
Whitechapel Mission to Tebay PM
Chapel, Thurs 27th, spoke on Sweated
Labour in London’s East End. The
PM Sunday School pupils have
scored high marks again in the
Scripture exams.

Mr. H. Blamire added a wing to his
house in Tebay but sent the RDC no
plans first. Said he didn’t know he
had to. Died at Old Tebay on 13th
November, Ann Stainton, 64.

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A Christian Alphabet—An occasional series.

Baptism: the ceremony and sacrament of welcoming a new member into the Christian community, involving repentance from sins, a declaration of personal faith in Jesus Christ, and a commitment to follow him and be involved in the life and worship of his church. It is a pity that all too often baptism has degenerated into an empty and purely traditional rite, with the participants having little or no intention of committing their lives to Christ.

Bible: the sacred Book of the Christian church, consisting of the 39 books of the Old Testament (written between 1500 and 400 BC), and the 27 books of the New Testament, written between about 40 and 70 AD. Christians describe it as the Word of God, and regard it as written by men inspired by his Holy Spirit, while there are differing understandings of how historically accurate it is, and how its authority should be interpreted in today’s world. Many Christians still read it regularly, even daily, as a way of seeking fellowship with and guidance from God; the public reading of Bible passages has always been a key element in Christian worship.

Body of Christ: A metaphor frequently used by St. Paul (e.g. I Corinthians 12, verses 12-27) to refer to the Christian community, with the implication that Christ is the head, and each individual believer is a limb of the body. Four points are made: (a) All limbs are different, and have different abilities and functions. (b) Each limb is important. (c) Limbs all need each other. (d) The body must obey the Head, Christ. (Some churches are an arthritic body – if anything moves, it hurts!)

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A VIEW FROM TEBAY

Having spent ten days in Staffordshire, where Keats' "Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness" was the norm, I returned to find within a day or so that it had become more like Thomas Hood's "November" a month early. Out have come the winter coat and thick pullover. A trip to Shap for my flu jab, the monthly meal for us "old 'uns", and a football final in Kendal the day after I returned brought me back to reality with a bang. Still, it is good to be home and seeing Tebay more or less unchanged.

One piece of good news in that the delayed work in the Hub—the provision of a toilet and new lighting for the main room—are likely to be completed by Christmas. We are already making use of the facility with the weekly "Drop-in" and library on a Monday morning, and the Community Choir practising in the evening. Also, Canon Tim Herbert is running a training course in the Hub for seven evenings. Such use of the room, once words gets around, is most encouraging. I find it most encouraging that the church is being used other than for services, and I was pleased to know that the Autumn Songs of Praise while I was away saw a good congregation of Anglicans and Methodists. If this is the pattern for the future so be it.

Just before we went away we had a valuable meeting about the Link's finances where a number of things were

discussed and the tone was optimistic despite the rising costs of printing. Then, on the evening before going, I attended a great event attended by people from all the five High Westmorland parishes at Shap Wells Hotel, where John Falshaw and David Aspden gave a fascinating slide show about Orton in the 50 years John and Margaret have been here. I am sure many fond memories—and possibly a few surprises—were brought to mind. Such events which bring the people of our scattered parishes together are invaluable to show us how fortunate we are to live in such an area.

Local football is likely to take up a fair bit of my time in the next month or so, with County Under 18 games against Lancashire and East Riding coming up, and a Senior game, featuring Appleby as our representative, in Hull later this month. Speaking of Appleby, who are one of the best teams in Westmorland, I am delighted to report that Lunesdale defeated them 3-2 last Saturday—and I was there!

November is a month which always means a lot to me, being the one in which I was born all those years ago, and the memories of Remembrance Sunday with all the emotions that stirs make it special. I can never forget that my dad and his three brothers all served in the army during World War One and all survived. Needless to say, if my dad hadn't done so I would not be here. Both he and my mum were great supporters of the British Legion and for many years my mum organised the distribution of poppies in Tebay. I always find

participation in the Remembrance Service very moving.

Ray Smith, the son of one of the men on our War Memorial, is coming up to Tebay for a few days later this month, and I know he will want to see what is being done in and around the church, where his mother played the organ for some years. Ray, unlike some who moved away from Tebay, likes to return from time to time and renew old acquaintances and refresh old memories. His mother's family—the Blamires—were well known in the district for many years.

I find as I get older my memories of childhood become hazy and it is good sometimes to reminisce with someone who shares them. Life in Tebay has changed so much, what with the decline of the railway and the subsequent development of the motorway, that it is difficult at times to remember what a thriving village it was when I was growing up here. I suppose it is still thriving but in a different way. My hope for what future I have here is to see the church take a more central role again, but that will depend on people younger than me. I believe that community life is as important as ever and that with God's help Tebay will continue to be a caring and happy place for families in years to come.

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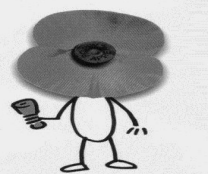

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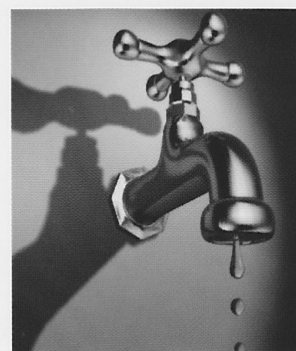
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Tebay Community Primary School News

ORTON MANOR COURT

Abridged Minutes of the Committee Meeting
held on 30th September 2013

PRESENT: 9 members and two visitors
Minutes: Minutes of the Meeting on Monday 29th
July 2013 were accepted.

Matters Arising from the Minutes:

Mowing of Verges: Judy and Wendy had written a
trenchant letter to CCC on the 19th September;
a reply had assured them that the matter
"would be looked into".

School Donation: £250 had been sent to the
school for further work on the Jubilee Garden.
Lay-by: twelve large boulders had been put around
the edges of the Lay-by.

Jubilee Tree plaque: Christopher said that a
plaque in Diabond (aluminium/plastic laminate)
would cost about £30.

Information Board: This was nearly finished and
had impressed a member who had inspected it.
It should be available for the committee to see
by the next meeting.

Planters in the Square: Graham Leckie had
cleared out all the old and overgrown vegetation,
and thanks were expressed to him, and to the
person who had arranged disposal. It was
agreed that three dumpy bags of composted
wood chippings would be bought at £15 each.
Three different plantings designed to give all-
year colour and low maintenance were planned.

Dame School: Christopher circulated a report on
work done and planned. The whole interior had
been given two coats of limewash. Cost: £61.04.
An outside display board draft was circulated and
agreed, to be erected on the verge, printed (A3
size) by Raven Graphics and backed with birch
ply. Cost - perhaps £30.

Four interior boards had been drafted, showing the
Michael Finch poem with Caroline Metcalfe-
Gibson's drawings, a history of the Dame School,
8 pages from the school log book, an outline of
Orton Manor Court, and two 1982 press cuttings.
Raven Graphic's quote for printing these on
Diabond was £214. Further work on the Dame
School was discussed, and the possibility of grant
funding should be investigated.

Vehicle Access to Kirkland Cottage grounds.

Commercial First, the company restoring the
cottage, had requested vehicle access over the
DMC paved area. This was AGREED.

Any Other Business

Land opposite Bousfield is not owned by DMC.

Treasurer's Report: The current account is
£2,313.44; the savings account is £8,705.02.

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Lune Ladies Meetings

In September Terry Bowes of the Wetheriggs Animal
Rescue Centre came to speak to our group, and left us
much better informed and very well entertained. The
Centre exists to take in and if possible heal abandoned or
injured creatures, return them to the wild, or rehome
them. Not cats and dogs, already well catered for, but
anything else, yes - red squirrels, farm animals, hamsters,
deer, porcupines ...They did not have room for the
elephant, but knew where in Europe it could be placed.
We were shown a rare frog, two beautiful snakes, a
tarantula (ouch!) and a glorious eagle owl. Don't worry,
the owl does get to fly, she is not a prisoner. If you have a
spare feeding bowl, scrubbing brush, can of pet food,
take it to Wetheriggs, they will use it. If you have a
grumpy teenager, get him or her to go there as a
volunteer. Wetheriggs don't just help broken animals,
they are good at humans too.

October's evening also concerned animals, but seen
through the eyes of a vet. Lesley Sanderson of

welcome the interspersed photographs of local scenery
and sunrises. Lesley came here twenty four years ago,
intending to stay a couple of years, and here she still is,
enjoying the variety of her work, the humans and the
animals she lives among, and the unsurpassable beauty of
the Eden countryside. J.B.

Red Squirrels Success!

I guess the phrase "so far, so good" applies to the Red Squirrel
situation in and around Ravenstonedale. The most encouraging
progress, I think, are the phone calls I get that indicate our Reds
are travelling to more isolated farms and houses and establishing
new communities.

So the messages from Fell End, from Kilnmire, Brownber and
elsewhere all suggest the establishment of viable satellite
breeding groups, away from the core areas such as Weasdale
and Ravenstonedale. The lack of sightings and reports of Grey
Squirrels, combined with this, to me means that we are on track
for the general re-establishment of native red squirrels.

So still be vigilant and report greys to me if seen (Frank on
015396 23638) or ring for advice. But a general **well done** and
thank you to all who have fed reds, and been interested enough
to hand in corpses (not nice, but still necessary), phoned me
about red sightings or how to encourage them... **it's working!**

PS - don't forget to buy hazel nuts!

Jean Greenhow

(Eulogy read at Jean’s Funeral in Lancaster, by son in law Alastair)

It's an honour for me to be asked to speak today about a lady I know as Mum and who welcomed me into the family, about a lady who was small enough to fit under my arm but who was tough, independent and very, very special. We celebrate her life. The 2nd January 1924 was the day when Mum was born, there were 5 girls in the family altogether with half-brothers and half-sisters too. She grew up in Long Marton near Appleby. In 1941 she joined the ATS and was a telephonist and plotter, she loved her job and on being discharged on 6 March 1946 her discharge read “Military Conduct- Exemplary. Private Simpson has been employed in an ordnance depot and at all times has worked well. She is honest and reliable and has cheerful personality. Previously she did good work with a searchlight battery.”

She spent time working at the Royal Oak in Appleby and at Helbeck Hall, she had tales to tell about working there -about the time in 1947 when steps had to be cut in the snow to reach Brough, about the under floor heating even in those days and about going on her bike with her friend Marion to the dances in Brough.

After marrying Albert in 1948 they lived at Ravenstonedale where Brenda and Linda were born in a tiny two-up two-down house which soon was too small. On the move again to the house where Mum lived the rest of her days, 55 years in this house in total, the latter 17 years after losing Albert living on her own.

When the girls were growing up cleaning jobs and dressmaking were done to help make ends meet. She took dressmaking classes to hone her skills and apparently when the latest fashion item of anoraks were requested by the girls she rose to the challenge and they had the anoraks they wanted. Nothing was too much trouble.

In the evenings she was rarely without knitting needles and taught the girls to knit, sew and do household tasks such as baking and ironing- she was a home-maker. Brenda and Linda recall that childhood Christmases were a special time, Albert always being complimentary after Christmas dinner, saying "good pudd Mum" ; brussel sprouts handpicked from the vegetable garden and lots of presents.
