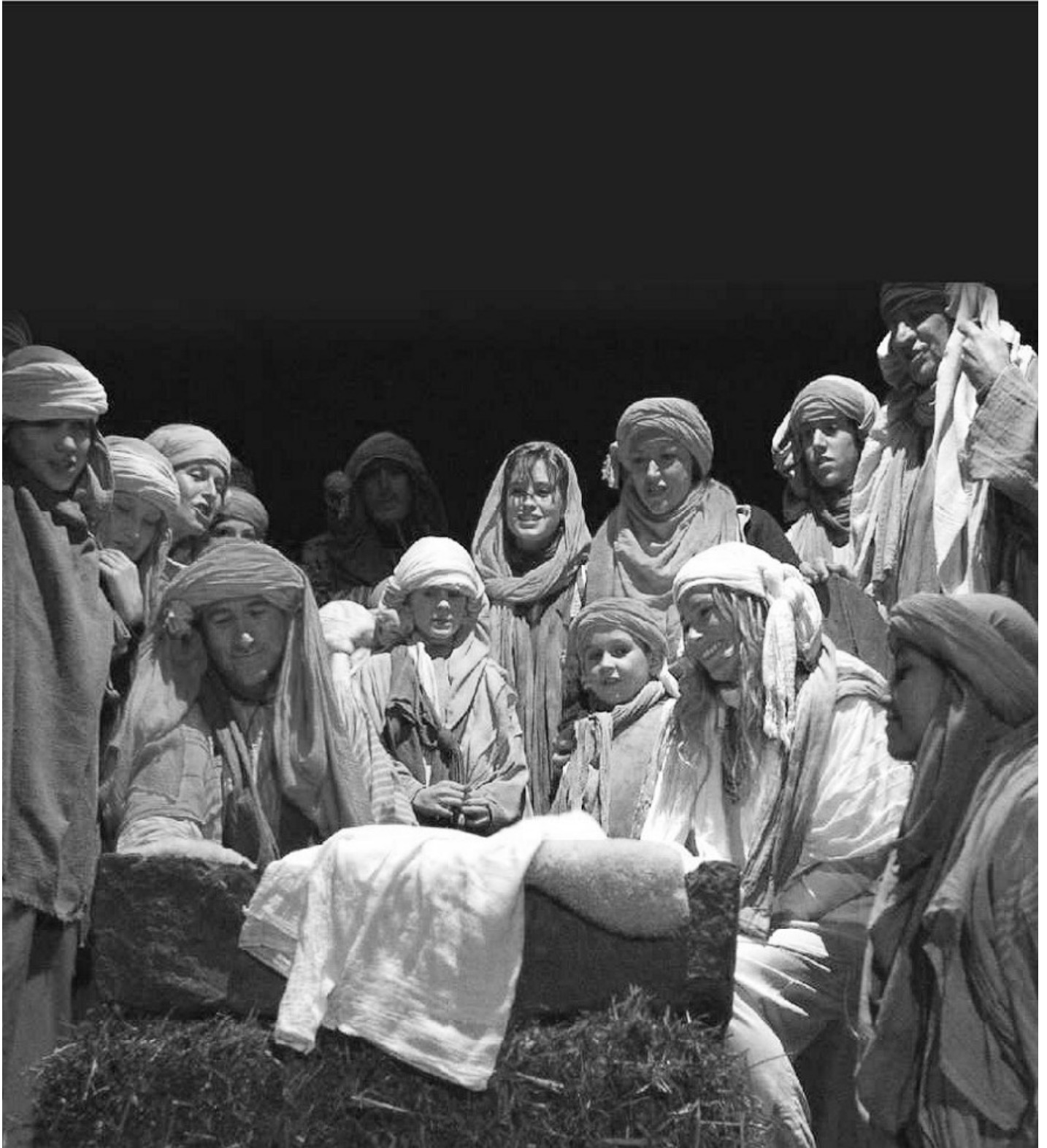

A thought from the Vicarage

Angels, angels everywhere....the
Christmas cards, the TV adverts.

Some in white, some cute, a few
images from old pictures with wings
and halos.

Well of course Angels do appear
quite a lot in the Christmas
story...but actually I have not read
that they had wings...re read the
story again in the Bible and check it
out – see if I am wrong.

The first angel that had a part in
what became the Christmas story
was not believed. He was named as
Gabriel and told the old man
Zachariah that he was to have a son
– despite the years without children
and the advanced years of his wife.
Gabriel just arrived when Zachariah
was in the middle of an ordinary
day's work in the Temple. Zachariah
asked for a sign and got more than
he bargained for; he was
dumbstruck until the baby was born
and he had to name him. His lack of
faith had consequences.

Then the same angel appeared
to Mary; a young, very ordinary
peasant girl. With her there was a
very different response. She
believed and accepted what could
not be possible humanly speaking.
She accepted with faith – 'I am the
Lord's servant. May it be to me as
you have said'. A girl, a good girl,
bravely faced the cruelty of gossip
and worse from her home village.
What was worse still, and must
have broken her heart, risking not
being believed by the man she
loved – Joseph.

Thankfully God sent an Angel to
Joseph in a dream and he risked
everything to marry Mary because
the message of the angel was that
Mary was truthful. He then had the
second most wonderful task in
history – to protect and care for the
Hope of the World – Jesus.

I know I have prayed for angels

from time to time, usually to be
with people I am worried about;
and I think I have had such visits
myself. They have not had wings or
long flowing hair on the whole but
they are the person who just turns
up, unexpectedly, when you are at
your lowest. They sometimes come
with a word of good sense,
sometimes with a listening ear;
sometimes just recalling us to our
better selves.

Angels are God's messengers.
When they come with important
news in the Bible they are recorded
because they come as something
special. I think there are messengers
who come that are not recorded in
Scripture but who nevertheless
have important messages of
comfort or of challenge. They may
look like our neighbour, our friend,
our work colleague but they are
important and our response to
them also matters as Mary and
Zachariah illustrate.

Angels listen to God, the God of
love that prompts the heart, and
are then prepared to go where they
are needed. They are a link between
heaven and earth.

At the birth of Jesus there was
some seriously good news to share
– a load of Angels, 'a heavenly host'
singing 'Glory to God in the highest
and on earth peace, good will
towards men.' Now that is a
message that needs a lot of
messengers.

May God help us to take that
message to our friends, family and
neighbours at this special time.

Notes from The Herald, December, 1914

Dull, wet, mild, few frosts, no new snow.

Orton's J.W. Lund is Hon.

Secretary of Tebay Poultry Show to be held on 31st December:

Entries, please. William Hully (Bousfield Farm) and Loughrigg (Ambleside) man up at Shap for buying horses for the Army at less than their value – adjourned to 30th December for enquiries. (W.H. was guilty of a mail-order scam in 1913 or so).

Greenholme Primitive Methodist Chapel was venue for Tebay Home and Foreign Missions evening on Saturday, 28th; at Tebay on 29th.

Orton 1864 In early November 1864, a dog savaged the sheep at Coatflatt, killing several which were found dead by the farmer Mr. Robert Armstead, Coatflatt Mill. One he could not find. "Look in odd places too" said a neighbour. "What about under your Mill's water wheel" - so he looked and there she was, very thin having had only water those three weeks. Tebay 1914 Mr. H. Dodd, foreman platelayer for 41 and a half years (a record) on the same section from 2 miles N of Tebay to Shap Summit, has retired. He has been one-eyed these twenty-eight and a half years too.

Ravenstonedale The P.M. Circuit Quarterly meeting at Tebay on Thursday afternoon, 3rd, placed Mr. F. Askew, Tebay, on the Plan for his first time as Exhorter (to become a local preacher next) and bade "three young men from Newbiggin on Lune to prepare to go on the Plan." Mr. W. Bainbridge (Newbiggin) was second of the two speakers. Next meeting is in June at Tebay. Few went to the public meeting that evening in Tebay's Assembly Hall there being a downpour etc. Two Rent-Audits were held in Ravenstonedale for the Metcalfe-Gibsons on 27th November. 1. For Mr. A of Coldbeck at the King's Head Hotel, 2. For Mr. T.A. at the

Black Swan Hotel. (The tenants paid their rent and were treated to dinner with toasts etc.)

Prizegiving at Newbiggin on Lune School in mid-December.

1864 Opening of the United Free Gospel Chapel at Newbiggin on Lune (architect was H. Law), a lot there.

Christmas, 1914 Orton, in vacancy, had only one service in the morning. The P.Ms had their Children's Tea on Saturday, 26th. Tebay P.Ms had their Christmas Cantata. Gaisgill Wesleyan Chapel had its Christmas Day Festival. The Metcalfe-Gibsons of Coldbeck House gave Ravenstonedale their annual Treat for the Church Sunday School also on 26th in the King's Head Assembly Room – tea, games, carols.

Kingdom of God: The Kingdom of God (or Kingdom of Heaven) is often mentioned by Jesus, but never refers to a place, like the United Kingdom. Rather the phrase means God's kingly rule. Sometimes Jesus says things like "The Kingdom of God is among you!" – as if it is here now. But often he speaks as if it is still in the future. Both "now" and "Not yet"! In the Lord's Prayer, we ask, "Thy kingdom come". What do we mean? Some hymns use these words to point to a longed-for time of peace and harmony: "When comes the promised time That war shall be no more?" This is a universal dream – but is it quite unreal? When we pray, "Thy kingdom come!" we might add, "Beginning with me!". In other words – "may I truly serve you as my King". If that is not what I want, there is no point in the petition.

Lamb of God: Twice John the Baptist, the cousin of Jesus who called people to repent of their sins in preparation for the coming of the Messiah, pointed to Jesus and said, "Behold the Lamb of God!" Once he added, "who takes away the sin of the world." "Lamb of God" became a title often used of Jesus, in prayers and hymns and in art. In our culture we think of a lamb as a cuddly little creature; or something to eat. Farmers see lambs as the future profit of their business. But when John called Jesus "Lamb of God", he was a Jew speaking to Jews; and Jews of that day understood about lambs taking away sin. It was the language of sacrifice. It pointed forward to Jesus dying for us. He died at Passover time – a festival when Jews remember that a lamb's blood saved them from God's judgement, and they then passed through the blood-sprinkled doorway to set out on a life of pilgrimage. That is true of Christians today who believe Jesus died for us.

It has been a busy month with Remembrance Day. It was good to see the church full and to be able to remember all those who have been lost in the two world wars and in more recent conflicts. Especial thoughts were centred on the men from Tebay who died in the First World War. Thanks are due to the work of the British Legion and especially our hard working local branch led by Graham Cave.

BUS

Our village as well as the surrounding area served by the 106 bus route between Penrith and Kendal has been deeply affected by the suspension of this service due to the County Council withdrawing subsidies for rural bus services, and the private operators not being sure if was financially viable without the subsidy. This has caused many problems to our villagers as was shown by the big turnout at the meeting at the Club. Many are affected by this including families with schoolchildren, those with appointments and treatment at the hospitals in Penrith and Kendal as well as those who attend Shap surgery for appointments, blood tests, hearing aid advice and chiropody. The 106 gave us opportunities to catch up with friends and relatives, shop etc. Living in a small village with little if any opportunity for a social life causes isolation and depression in a big way. Let's do all we can to get the bus on the road again.

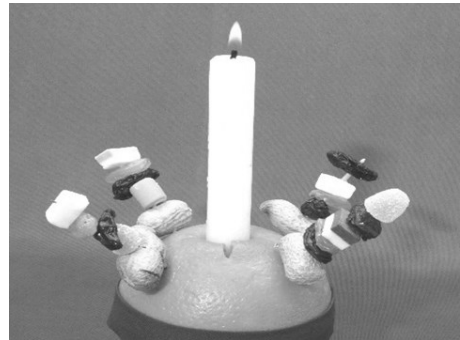
PEACE

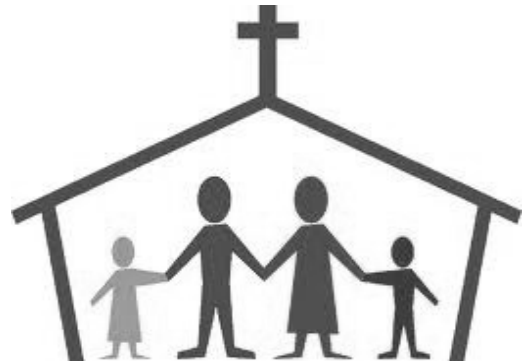

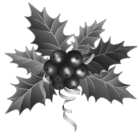

The loss of the 106 Bus Service

The sudden loss of the 106 Bus Service has caused many problems to people in this area, and there have been public meetings about it. Councillor Libby Bateman has been working hard to try to find solutions:

1 – **Immediate Crisis Solution** – Cumbria County Council already has a community transport scheme on the shelf, ready to go, known as the Voluntary Social Car Scheme—<http://www.cumbria.gov.uk/roads-transport/public-transport-road-safety/transport/commtrans/voluntarycars.asp>. This scheme could help get people from A-B now, while an alternative solution to the loss of the 106 is sought.

2 – **Medium Term goal** – We need to get the 106 back

on the road in some way. There may be an operator who would be willing to cost out a daily rate,.

3 – **Long Term solution** – I believe there is scope for a Not-for-profit company (perhaps a Charitable Incorporated Organisation) to be set up to facilitate the running of the loss making buses. This could be managed by a group of directors with representation from operators, residents and community leaders.

EDEN LOCAL PLAN 2014-2032 :
Calling for your Feedback &
Suggestions

As a result of the Government requiring every single Council across the country to identify sites for housing to meet future population needs, Eden District Council have allocated that at least 10 houses are built in Orton, including an 'affordable' housing need of 2. The original draft of the Local Plan identified 7 proposed sites in Orton which, in the latest version, became just one site at The Mires - that is, the land to the north of West End Road, behind Kirkland House/Farrers Cottage, Farrers Barn / Smithymire.

In 2009, when Orton was awarded Conservation Area status, one of the deciding factors giving the village its unique character were the number of 'Key views' within Orton. The views across the 'The Mires' to the Church is one of these beautiful 'Key Views' which is greatly admired by visitors and locals alike. However, this is the only site which is now proposed for development.

Owing to a hiccup in arrangements, Orton residents were not advised in time of the full public consultation period. So Eden's Executive and Leader have extended the period in which we can give comment and suggestions - and ask that this is done as a matter of urgency now so they can take comments on board to inform the next stage in finalising the Local Plan.

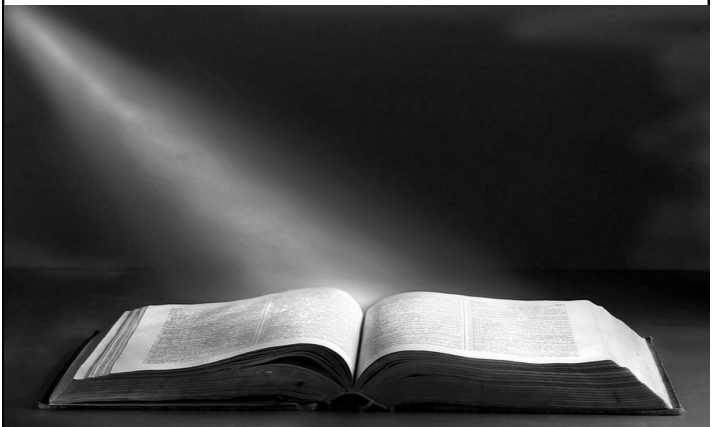

Taking Shape

Sometimes hearing passages from the Bible read in church can seem a bit like picking up one piece of a jigsaw. The piece may be attractively coloured or somewhat dull and uninteresting. It may contain something quite recognisable (like someone's face) or appear totally incomprehensible. But the more pieces are fitted together the more the overall picture begins to take shape – and the more sense we can make of the individual piece itself as we begin to see it in its wider setting.

Does it actually matter whether we make any serious effort to fit the pieces of the Bible together or can we just be content to pick them up one at a time, look at them, reflect on them a little and then put them back on the table? Christians believe that this book (more accurately, collection of books) is one of the primary means God uses to speak to us about himself, the world he has made, the amazing love he has shown to us as his creatures, and the relationship he invites us to share with him as children with a loving father. All of which, to my mind, adds up to a pretty strong reason to make the most sense we can of this book so that we can understand more clearly what it's all about – and what God might want to be saying to us through it.



If you feel that any of this rings bells with you (or if you are simply curious to understand more of this book which has had such a massive impact on our culture for many centuries), you might enjoy sharing in a 6-week course published by The Bible Society called “Taking Shape – seeing the Bible whole”. We will be working through this course at Orton Vicarage at 4.00 pm on Tuesdays 3rd, 10th, 17th February and 3rd, 10th, 17th March. If you would like to join us – or would just like to know more about it – please have a word with Ian Elliott (24441). It would be a help if you could do this sooner rather than later so that we have time to order enough copies of the course booklet to go round.

"So you just got out in time then!"

Words I heard more than once as we flew home from Israel the day after the latest escalation of tension/violence in Jerusalem. To be honest, it didn't feel as if we were escaping from a dangerous war zone by the skin of our teeth. We had just spent ten wonderful days walking where Jesus walked in different parts of the land in glorious weather (our first, light rain started as we were walking to the coach for transfer to the airport for our flight home!).

A few days before, we had wandered without any feeling of threat around the Temple Mount, the focus of this week's trouble. I **had** noticed that access regulations seemed to have tightened up since my last visit - before the 2nd, more violent, Intifada (Palestinian uprising). Non-Moslems are no longer allowed inside the Dome of the Rock or the Al Aqsa Mosque (previously we'd been able to wander in and out of both quite freely) and our guide seemed in a bit of a hurry to conclude our visit and move us on (we gathered because it was nearly time for one of the official times of prayer when the presence of "infidels" is not welcomed).

Of course threat levels are rising as tension grows. Tension continues to grow across the Middle East, with violence and displacement, the threat posed by IS, and the struggle so many face to make a living and provide enough water and power. But this is not only true of the Middle East. While we were in Israel we heard of shootings in *Canada* of all places! In 1993, six months after we moved to our last parish in Warrington, the IRA planted bombs within fifty yards of our church.

I'm reminded of the years (during the height of the Northern Ireland "Troubles") when we took our young family to spend every summer holiday with their grandparents. People would look at us wide-eyed and say "You're not taking them to *Ireland* are you?" To which I would reply (slightly tongue-in-cheek) that it would be more dangerous to take them to Birmingham (it was when the Birmingham pub bombings and similar occurrences were still fresh in people's minds).

So many of the folk we met know (and Christians certainly *ought* to know) that you can't find security in circumstances. You need to go deeper than that and be sure of your true identity as a child of God. David, Israel's greatest king in Old Testament times, started out as a shepherd, leading his sheep in search of good pasture as shepherds do in that region. As leader of an emerging nation, he knew "The Lord is my shepherd" – the ultimate leader. He knew and rejoiced that God was prepared to identify with him, that the Lord had undertaken to bless and provide for him "all the days of my life". David didn't know everything, he made many mistakes and failed many times, but he was sure of this. Whether he was resting in green pastures by quiet waters, or in the presence of his enemies (he had more than his fair share!), or walking "through the valley of the shadow of death", he knew that the Lord was leading him, that "goodness and loving kindness will follow me all the days of my life", and that "I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever." *Whatever* happens!

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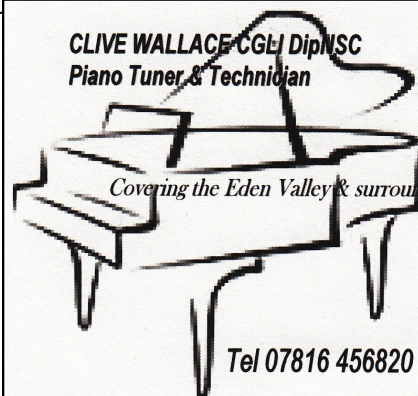
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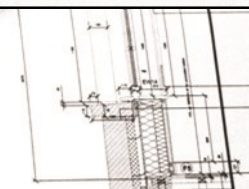
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
