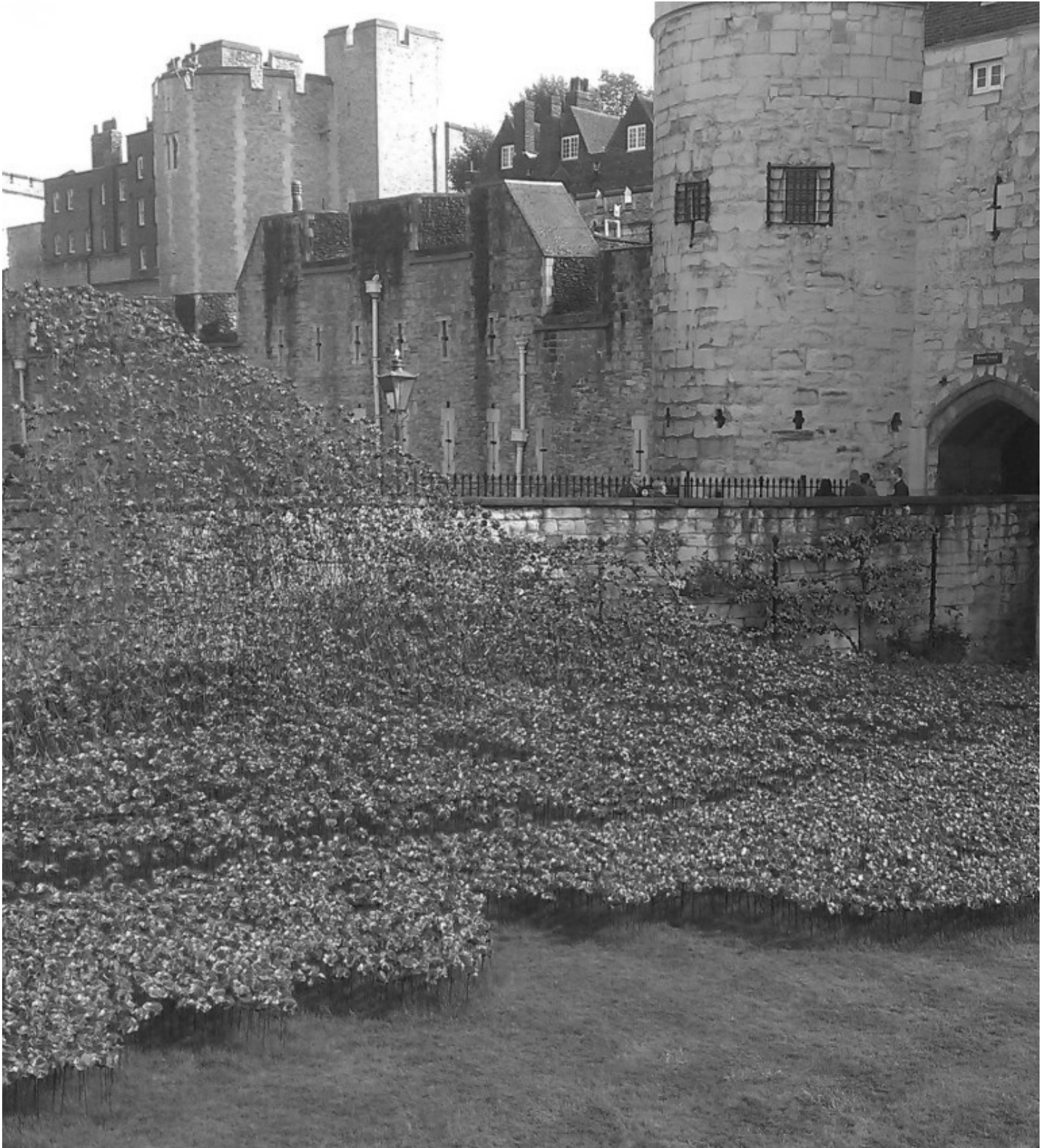

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A thought from the Vicarage

With the 100th Anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War this will be a particularly poignant time of Remembrance this year.

In September Brian and I were in London and we made our way to see the poppies around the Tower of London.

It was deeply moving to see this field of red, ceramic flowers – one for each death in WW1. Each one is handmade and therefore unique. They spill out of the tower and flow in waves of intense crimson around the moat.

If you get a chance to go and see them – do. It really brings the enormity of the loss of life to mind. Each flower represented a person, no two exactly alike; just like the people they represent. Each different – each with so much potential – each sadly robbed of that precious gift of life.

We look back and wonder. Books and films and websites have been written to debate the rights and wrongs of this conflict

just as they have over other major conflicts before and since. Were we right to embark on the fight? Did people make the wrong decisions about the style of warfare or the tactics? What about those who could not follow it through and were 'shot at dawn'? The ethics of warfare are complex and challenging.

This year we will be remembering those lost in the two World Wars and other conflicts since in the context of British air strikes in the Middle East. Some people feel that this is a situation that cannot be left to develop as 'Islamic State' is a great evil and cannot go unchallenged. While others look at our history of warfare in this part of the world and see our 'interference' as just creating more extremists as widows and children vow to take revenge on the 'murderers' of their loved ones. What do you think?

'What does it matter what I think?' you may ask, 'I'm not in a position to change anything'. I'd like to say that what we think influences how we pray, and I believe in prayer. I believe we all need to think: 'How will we remember this conflict in the future?'

9th November is Remembrance Sunday this year – do join us, if you can, at the War Memorials in each of our villages, and in the meantime – please pray.

Notes from the Herald, November 1914

Fine, mild until sudden heavy snow on Sunday 15th. Fine till 21st, colder; dull and colder final week. Winter set in on the Western Front mid-month too: appeals for mittens, scarves, balaclavas etc. for the troops were met by local knitters. Those at the Front can have the Herald for 1d a week (=60p now).

Orton: Mr. John Bowness Sharp, Wardale Head, applied for a faculty to erect a memorial on south wall of Orton Church to William Sharp B.A.(Cantab) who had just become Vice-Principal of Victoria College, Gwalior, India, when he died. The Sharps have been in Orton these 500 years. William went to Orton Primary School and won scholarships to Cambridge. The Maharajah of Gwalior thought highly of him. Faculty was granted (see report 21st Nov). The Rev. Mr. Tilbury was still Vicar of Orton when he backed the Sharp faculty, but had left by 22nd when Orton's two services were led by the Rev. H. B. Taylor (a former Curate of Brough). The Feoffees of Orton met on Wed. 23rd and fixed on early January to choose the next Vicar. They have fourteen to choose from. It was voted in Westmorland to let boys of 13 or over work on farms during the War.

Tebay's famous triplet calves sold well at Penrith Mart on 11th for Mr. H. Milner, Old Tebay, their owner. All three have calved. The Station has three signal boxes, whose staff's total of years with the Railway is longest of any between Lancaster and Carlisle. Longest service (48 years) is Mr. William Askew who helped catch the three Netherby Burglars (1880s)

James Pearson, 23, shunter, Penrith Goods Yard, was transferred to Tebay three weeks ago, but on Friday 20th the points were wrongly set and he was crushed between the trucks and died. Eleanor Horn, pupil of Tebay Primitive Methodist Sunday School won first prize for the District in the Scripture exam. She had 93%.

R.D.C. report is awaited from Newcastle consultants on Mount Pleasant's sewers. Also, the Railway's 50 houses' drain is filthy and stinks where it falls into the river. As well as sewage it lets out oil and fine cinders (now on the riverbed) – to prod the LNWR again.

Ravenstonedale: Died on 5th: Robert Whitfield, 64, retired farmer, "kindly". On 14th, Miss Mary Alderson, 84, lifelong here; long a servant of the late Mr. Richard Gibson at Coldbeck.

A Christian Alphabet—An occasional series.

Jehovah: The name given to God in parts of the Old Testament, but in fact an inaccurate attempt to express the Hebrew name YHWH. Ancient Hebrew had no written vowels; in later forms vowel sounds were added above or below the consonants. No one knows quite how YHWH was pronounced – perhaps "Yahweh". But the Jews regarded the name of God as too holy to pronounce, and when reading the Scriptures aloud they substituted another word, Adonai, meaning "The Lord". When vowel indicators were added to the text, the vowel sounds of "Adonai" were added to the written consonants of "YHWH" – which made it look like "Yehowah". But there was no such word! In most English Bible translations, YHWH is represented by "The LORD".

Jesus: Another sacred name! In fact the New Testament name Jesus is the Greek form of the Hebrew name Joshua. The name means "God saves" or "Saviour". The Old Testament Joshua led his people from the desert into the Promised Land – a foreshadowing of Jesus. Before Jesus was born, both Mary his mother, and Joseph her husband, were told separately by an angel that Jesus was the name to be given to the child. Joseph was told why: "For he shall save his people from their sins." (*Matthew 1.21*).

Justification: This is an important word in the explanation of what Jesus does for those who trust in him. It means "forgiveness", but it means more than that: it means the complete restoration of our relationship with God. How can we find this restored relationship? "Since we are **justified** by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." (*Romans 5.1*) Who has made it possible? Jesus, through his death and resurrection (*Romans 4.24*). How do we enter into it? By faith – not by trying to be good, as if we can achieve it by ourselves, but by putting our trust in Jesus. What is the result? Peace with God.

A VIEW FROM TEBAY

I am writing this article in October and winter seems to suddenly have descended – the forecasters tell us that the temperatures are correct for this time of year but we have been spoilt by the lovely hot summer and the fabulously warm and dry September. I am particularly pleased with the weather as we have scaffolding around three sides of the house and for three weeks we could not see our magnificent views of the Howgill Fells. Now we can see them, minus the hessian, but all we want now are just two dry days for the house to be painted – looking at the projected weather forecasts I am not too sure when this will be.

October heralds the changing colours of the leaves – we have three field maples in the nursery, ready to be planted out by next March, and the colours of their leaves are magnificent – even though they are only growing in pots. The green on our silver birch trees is just beginning to fade so these leaves promise to be another fabulous shade. We are told that everything has its season and season will follow season and this is so true, especially in the garden when each year we have these magnificent displays.

At the end of October we have Hallowe'en which really is the eve of All Hallows or All Saints. Halloween is celebrated in many ways with strange and interesting customs. It is a real mixture of ancient pagan ideas, folklore and religion. Long ago it was the end of the Celtic year with its ceremonial extinguishing and lighting of fires. The following day, 1st of November, became All Saints' Day which was a very holy day when many of the lesser saints (who do not have their own day) are remembered. It is hardly surprising that the old day of darkness should be a time of mystery, when ghosts, witches and the 'little folk' had to be avoided and evil spirits needed to be driven away. This was their busy night: they would not dare to be

around on All Hallows. Today, Halloween is one of the popular festivals throughout the UK and USA. Pumpkins are hollowed out and decorated, games of Snap Apple (on a piece of string) or Duck –apple (in a bowl of water) are played. Times have changed. People are no longer afraid of evil spirits. Halloween is no longer a day of fear but a day of fun.

This month of November sees more festivals – Guy Fawkes' night on 5th November, when we celebrate with bonfires and fireworks, remembering the plot when a group of conspirators devised a plan to blow up the Houses of Parliament at a time when the king, James I was there in 1605 with the MPs. Fortunately they were discovered in time before the gunpowder was lit.

The major festival of November is the Festival of Remembrance. On the second Saturday of the month, the Royal Albert Hall in London, is filled (twice) with people who have gone to take part in the Festival of Remembrance. It is a moving occasion with military music, hymns, prayers and a procession of flags carried by members of The Royal British Legion. This festival is held in memory of those people who died while serving in the two world wars, 1914-1918 and 1939-1945. We also remember those who gave their lives in Korea, Suez, Northern Ireland, the Falklands, the Gulf, Bosnia, Iraq and in Afghanistan. On the following day, Remembrance Sunday, services are held at war memorials in towns and villages throughout Britain. The best known of these is the one held at the Cenotaph in Whitehall, London, at which the Queen and others lay wreaths in memory of the dead.

This year is 100 years since the beginning of World War One and at St James, Tebay we are having a special service of remembrance. This has been specially written to remember the 92 volunteers from Tebay who joined up and especially the 14 who never returned. The service is at 10.30am and I do hope many of you will come to join us in this special remembrance.

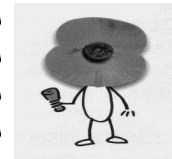

Darkness to Light

I was asked to write this article following the last eighteen months of treatment for bladder cancer; I hope it will be a help to others on life's journey with various illnesses.

At first I pondered: should I or should I not go to my GP? I did, and straightway he arranged my first appointment at hospital for various tests. Following the tests a nurse came to my bedside and said, "You have got cancer, and we will be seeing a lot of you over the coming months" - and they have!

I left hospital that day and drove home. The most difficult part was telling my family; they were in shock because I was active and appeared very fit and full of energy. My main task at that point and over the months ahead was to keep cheerful and upbeat, determined to beat it - not easy at times.

Over the last eighteen months I have been in theatre seven times and in and out of hospital many times. My care at hospital and at home has been outstanding, and the support received from church and community has been overwhelming. I had always been very active and it was very hard to be restricted in what I could do; but while in hospital I soon found a new role, giving time and support to other patients and spending time talking with them.

One man was very concerned about his condition which was similar to what I had gone through. I was able to share my experience with him and help to prepare him for going home. On the day he was going home he and his wife came to me and said what a blessing I had been to them. Wherever and in whatever state

we find ourselves, we can use the gifts we have been given to benefit others.

On one occasion I went into hospital in an emergency situation. The lady doctor said, "John," (that was my hospital name!) "You are always cheerful and have a smile - how come?" I said I had a strong Christian faith and many people supporting me with their prayers. She placed her hand on my shoulder and said, "That's what you need in times like these."

In hospital you always find someone worse than yourself. I remember one afternoon two prison warders coming in with a young teenage boy handcuffed to them. He had been self-harming, cutting his arms. In the evening my grandsons came to visit; they were shocked to see this on my ward and said to their mum on their return, "Is Granddad safe in there?"

To those who are anxious about their health and wondering what action to take, I'm pleased now I took action - it was in my long term interest. Don't wait too long! It has been hard and difficult at times, but when I was told I was clear of cancer it was very emotional but wonderful news. May I thank many people for their prayers and support which has helped me through this difficult time.

I will finish with a verse from a hymn which helped me.

Great is thy faithfulness,
Great is thy faithfulness,
Morning by morning
New mercies I see.
All I have needed
Thy hand has provided;
Great is thy faithfulness,
Lord, unto me.

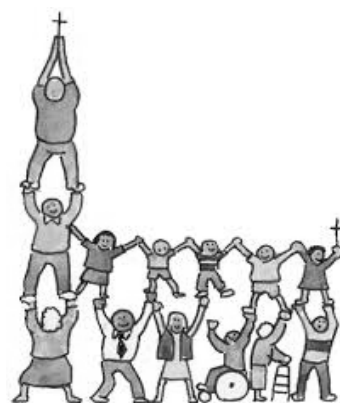

WELL DRESSING

The custom originated within the Peak District and the earliest recorded well dressing was in Tissington in 1349. Oliver Cromwell did his best to stamp out the custom which did die out apart from in the determined village of Tissington. The use of flower collages developed in Victorian times, thanks to the Art & Craft movement and now over 60 towns and villages take part in Well Dressing.

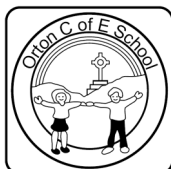

Abridged Minutes of the Committee
Meeting held on Monday 29th
September 2014

1. PRESENT: 9 committee members.
There were 3 apologies.
2. Minutes: Minutes of the Committee Meeting on Monday 9th June had been circulated and were accepted.
3. Matters Arising from the Minutes:
 - i. Verges: The letter to Cumbria County Council had not yet been sent.
 - ii. Vehicle Access to Kirkland Cottage grounds. No further news.
4. Treasurer's Report: The savings account held £8,709.38; the current account £2,144.45. It is likely that the Single Farm Payment will cease from 2015 onwards because OMC has insufficient acreage to qualify. This will reduce OMC's income by about £1,100, or 40%.
5. Information Board: Three quotations had been obtained for printing the board (30" wide, 32" high). It was agreed to proceed with the cheapest for £85. It was agreed to pursue the idea of a dry stone plinth - further details of design and cost would be obtained. It was agreed that the original copy of artwork should be displayed in the Hall. A 3-fold leaflet, giving further local information, was being prepared.
6. Any Other Business: Dame School: The chimney would be swept of birds' nests to improve ventilation. It was discussed again whether to display an exterior sign, perhaps on the door, and designs would be prepared for the next meeting.
7. Date of next committee meeting: Monday 24th November.

Dogs in the countryside

The farming community in Cumbria have highlighted their concern regarding a disease called Neosporosis. The disease is caused by the parasite Neospora caninum and is thought to be responsible for the highest percentage of all cattle abortions reported in the UK. Once Neosporosis infection has occurred in a cattle herd it can persist within the herd due to the vertical transmission of the parasite between cows and calves.

Research suggests that Neospora eggs are produced by infected dogs and excreted in their faeces. Cattle will become infected if they eat food or drink water contaminated with Neospora eggs.

If you walk dogs in the countryside, please be aware of this and remove dog faeces as you would in Towns and Villages - especially where you see signs like the one below.

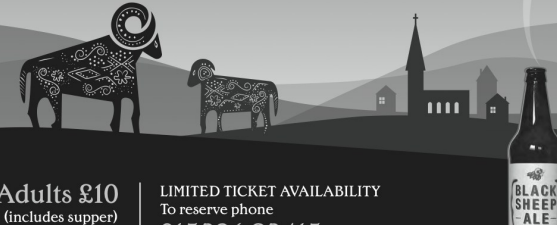

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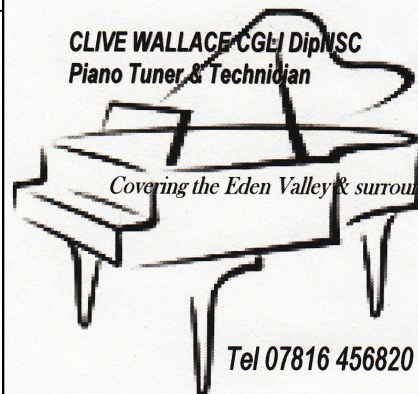

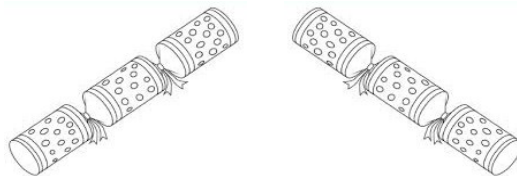
