A thought for the month

From Andy Glanville

Called to Serve

My parents were regular churchgoers and my two brothers and I naturally followed. Although I did not consciously have a relationship with God, I always left the evening service in Oxford with an overwhelming sense of peace and 'wellbeing', in spite of the prospect of school the following day!

On my 19th birthday, I started my training as a police officer with Thames Valley Police. I remained in the police for thirty years, during which time I had many interesting experiences.

I think it is fair to say that God helped and guided me hugely through this (main) period of my working life, but of course I was too busy, too wrapped up in work, friendships etc. to notice. Alison and I moved from Berkshire to Cumbria in 1996 and bought a house in Sedbergh. I attended St. Andrews there, rather intermittently, and then in December 2009, on the day it started seriously snowing with a vengeance, we moved to Gaisgill.

It was natural to decide then on a church to attend and I quickly decided on All Saints at Orton. The churchgoers at Orton quickly accepted me and I felt at home in the community there. I also became more aware of God's influence and began, slowly, to realise that He is always there, in the background. Hold that thought! I was also influenced, not only by our vicar, Beverley, with her wonderfully enthusiastic zest for 'the church', God's Church, but all the other people playing important parts, for instance

Sandra, Chris and Ian. Anyway, Beverley was running a course, entitled 'Called to Serve', and thought it would be good for me, so I decided to give it a go. I did, though, explain to her that it was purely for selfish reasons, as I wished to examine my own faith.

The course runs from September to July, the groups meeting roughly every fortnight, with breaks at Christmas and Easter. The subject matter is of interest to all and includes examining our faith, how we put this into practice and also what gifts God has given us and how we use them. There is not enough space here to give a more complete list of everything covered. Differing views from course members invariably make for fascinating discussions.

The course was the best thing I have ever done, spiritually. Having completed it, I then acted as a group leader for the next course – for me, it was the natural progression of my journey. I learned a lot about my faith, with input from the other people in the groups. It was wonderful to read feedback at the course conclusion; that each person had found the course changed, positively, their spiritual life, in a different way for each person!

As for me and my journey – remember that thought to hold? I learned many things, and continue to learn, but the single most important thing I learned is that God is not in the background but there, in front, leading me, influencing me, loving me. Until I experienced 'Called to Serve', I was just too 'busy' to notice.

Notes from The Herald, October 1915

Weather fine, dry, colder.
Maximum 55, minimum 35.
Swallows left in third week of
September. Drought by mid
October.

Orton Wesleyan's Harvest
Festival was on Sun and Mon
26/27th September. Bretherdale's
Harvest Festival was in its public
hall on 26th, a Wesleyan do.
Public meeting, Tuesday 27th to
round it off. The Vicar of Orton
preached at Shap Church's
Harvest services on Friday, 8th.
(Shap's continued on Sunday
10th).

Bretherdale harboured a deserter
from Updale near Rosgill, Henry
Hall by name, caught at his
brother in law's at Eskew Head;
up in Court mid October but no
ruling was made. At Eskew Beck
House was Mr. J. Dinsdale, 87,
who died there this month; born
in Garsdale he walked four miles
a day each way to a Dame School
for two years, his sole education.
He came to Bretherdale 56 years
ago to a small farm. His wife
died six years later. He was a
Wesleyan local Preacher for over
60 years. They had two
daughters. He was buried at
Orton.

Greenholme School needs a Head
Teacher, (female, certificated)
£90 p.a.. (*Had they wanted a
man he would have got £110*).

Tebay – Three farmers from Old
Tebay up at Hackthorpe Court for
letting their horses stray on roads
near Howgill Lodge, Orton.
They were found by Police
Inspector McCaum. Two were
fined 10/-, one 5/-. They were
Thomas Stainton and Thomas
Shepherd and Charles Wills. The
Tebay LNWR Ambulance Class
presented Mr. H. Wood,
signalman, with a clock on 13th,
on his moving from Tebay to
Penrith. Cllr. T. Capstick, newly
co-opted for Tebay on E.

Westmorland R.D.C. was
welcomed to his first meeting this
month.

Gaisgill sent a lot of fell stags
(*fell ponies*) to Brough Hill Fair
on 30th September as did Orton
and Ravenstonedale. Good
prices got. A fine day (usually it
rained). Gaisgill Band of Hope
Picnic and Sports on Sat 25th
September in Mr. H. Capstick's
field at Rayne. 50 children there
competing for 40 prizes. Free tea
and bag of sweets for each child
at the end. Wanted: Winter
Eatage for 50 blackfaced hogs -
Edward Beck, Gaisgill, Tebay.
Raisbeck's Henry Atkinson was
second in the Guess the Weight
of the Bullock at Brought Hill on
30th September. It was 39 stone 1

lb (guessed by Mrs. Allen,
Sandford). Henry's guess was
39 stone 2 lb.

Ravenstonedale Wesleyan's
Harvest was 26/27th September.
Monday had meeting, supper and
sale of produce. The Church's
was on Friday and Sunday, 1st
and 3rd October. On Friday
Tebay's old Vicar the Rev
R.W.A. Ecroyd preached; he's
now in Carlisle.

Newbiggin on Lune Prim.

Methodist Chapel's harvest was
on 3rd and 4th, concert and sale on
Monday.

Prices much as September 1915;
meat is 2d lb more.

A Christian Alphabet—An occasional series by Christopher Jenkin

Music: Music is found very early in human pre-history – according to Genesis, Lamech, who was the 7th generation after Adam, was “the father of all who play the harp and lute”! Music was a huge part of Hebrew culture as is evident from many places in the Old Testament; not only in worship but in all sorts of ordinary celebrations and festivities. It was often linked with dancing. There was music to celebrate victory in battle, and the harvest, and marriage. Music was used for mourning as well as times of gladness. It was an integral and important part of worship – there are full descriptions of the choir and orchestra organized by David. We cannot precisely identify all the many different instruments used, but it certainly included wind, strings and percussion. Singing was both led by trained choirs (sometimes two halves responding to each other) and by soloists, and also exuberantly by all the people without rehearsal. There is less said about music in the New Testament, but we are told that Jesus and his disciples sang a hymn at the Last Supper. We can certainly see musical gifts as given by God to enhance and enrich human life in all its aspects.

Name: Names are important in Scripture. Children were named to express some truth or hope for their character or destiny. Jesus was given his name – before his birth – to express a vital truth about who and what he was: the name means “God saves” or “Saviour, rescuer, deliverer”. Another name applied to Jesus (though not apparently used of him during his earthly life) was “Emmanuel”, which means “God with us”. The phrase “the holy Name of God”, frequently used in Old and New Testament, represents much more than what we happen to call God: it means “God present among us, in all his revealed character and power.”

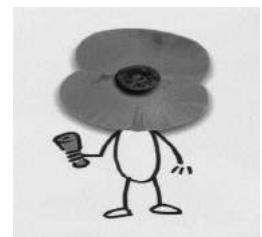

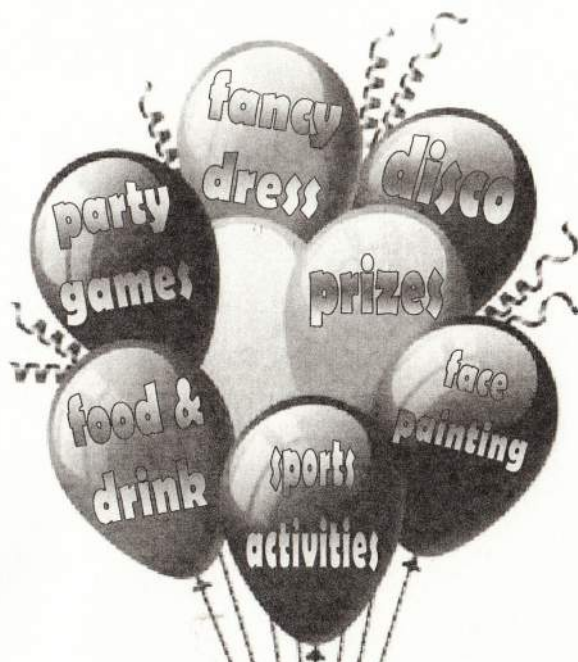

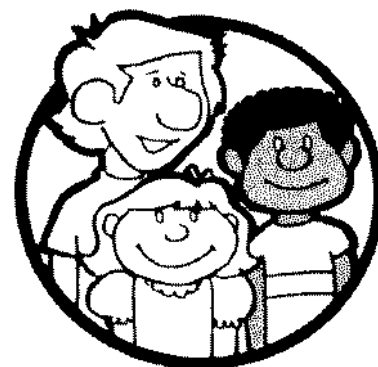

ORTON MANOR COURT

Abridged Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Monday 7th September 2015

PRESENT: 12 committee members and one Visitor. There were two apologies.

1. **Minutes:** Minutes of the Committee Meeting held on Monday 8th June 2015 were accepted.
2. **Matters Arising from the Minutes:**
 - a. (Item 4a) Registration of the Dame School land is being investigated.
 - b. (Item 4c) The chairman had registered with the Rural Payment Agency.
 - c. (Item 6) Framing and mounting the Information Board was still delayed by illness but alternative plans are in hand. The school will be asked if they would like the second copy.
 - d. (Item 11b) Thanks were expressed to those who filled in the layby potholes.
3. **Treasurer's Report:** The savings account held £8,714.90; the current account £2,463.73.
4. **Any Other Business:**
 - a. Beck clearing: a large team of volunteers had worked on clearing the beck. Some matters still need sorting: (a) Ash trees too near the bank; (b) places where the retaining beck wall had slipped. (c) The footpath to the school by Becks Cottage needs re-surfacing; there was uncertainty whether this is OMC or Parish Council's responsibility; it was suggested that OMC and PC should co-operate in this matter. Some committee members would do a short site visit after the meeting to discuss further work needed.
 - b. Gamelands / Knott Lane: someone had been dumping lawn grass cuttings on the verge along this lane, which would harm wild flowers. It was suggested a sign pointing to Gamelands Neolithic Stone Circle should be fixed to the public footpath signpost at the road junction. The Parish Council would discuss this.
 - c. The verge with large stones on the roadside towards the Hearse House needs strimming around the stones so that they are visible; a member volunteered to do this.
5. **Next Committee meeting:** Monday 9th November.

MORE FROM UGANDA

Email from Robert Zziwa, former Lay Reader of All Saints, Kasese, now doing Ordination Training.

(This item was included in September's Link, but a printer error rendered it unreadable, so we repeat it here.)

Rev Chris and Mary, I am writing to inform you that the college chose me with another theology student from Kinkiizi diocese (whom we are studying with) to go for a missionary ministry to North Karamoja diocese in Kotido district in the north-eastern region of Uganda. This region has a population of around 966,245 people and of which 75% is traditional religion while only 25% is Christianity. This place in fact is somewhat hard to reach and also it is semi-arid in climate. We are going there from 30th August to 30th September 2015. This will be part of our course field work - one month field work will be done in Karamoja and three months in our diocese.

I am requesting your prayers for the following:-

1. God to equip us with the real message which will bring impact to the Karamojong.
2. More souls to be fetched to His heavenly kingdom and embrace Christ.
3. Discipleship work should leave a self-propagating, self-sustaining and self-governing church.
4. God to encourage and strengthen us in this new culture, environment and ministry.
5. God's favour and good health upon us.

Hoping that you will also inform the brethren at All Saints, Orton, to pray for us during this ministry in Karamoja because this is going to be a new experience of ministry and where I also pray that God will enable us to learn new things.

I and Anna are praying for your pastoral visit to Kasese in November this year; how we wish to see you at that time and continue to share more experiences of ministry with you.

I asked Robert for his colleague's name, so that I could mention their mission in our parish magazine. He responded:

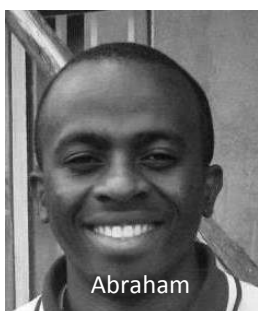

Greenholme School.

The PCC wishes to inform all parishioners that the sale of Greenholme School has now been completed. The process has been lengthy and has not been easy. Some people will know the history much better than others but briefly the school was closed as a school in 1963 and was acquired by All Saints' Church. It was used for occasional services for a period after which it was rented out to a school from Gosforth near Newcastle who used it as an "outward bound centre" for a number of years but in 2006 they relinquished the tenancy.



The rent received gave some income which helped to cover maintenance and insurance costs but since the school gave up the tenancy, the PCC has had to pay the council tax, insurance & electrical costs. For the year 2014 alone these came to over £750. For the past nine years the costs of the school have been a drain on the resources of Church with no prospect of gaining any income from it.

For this reason the decision was taken to sell the property but in order to do this, costs had to be incurred in order to gain planning permission and so make the building a more "saleable" proposition for any prospective buyers. A willing buyer was found but then it became apparent that the land between the building and the road had not been registered along with the building.

We therefore had no option but to negotiate a "deed of easement" with Lowther Estates.

This has meant that the PCC has had to pay £30,000 to Lowther without which the sale could not have gone ahead.

In addition to the above there have been the obvious costs of estate agents, legal fees plus some other minor ones. On top of all of these costs, we still have one more substantial cost to meet in the future. We will have to pay an "affordable housing levy" to Eden D.C. which will be 3% of the value of the property when it has been completed. This means that at the present time it is impossible to give an exact figure for this item.

This will leave the PCC with a sum of money which can be used to do much needed maintenance work on All Saints with priority to be given to the lime washing needed on the tower in order to keep it waterproof.

The PCC would like to take this opportunity to record our thanks to Alan Moore of the Old Vicarage, Orton. Alan has given his time for free and worked tirelessly on our behalf, often in very difficult circumstances in order to facilitate the completion of the sale.

We hope the purchasers can now turn the building into a pleasant and happy home rather than see the alternative sad decline of the property as would have been the case without the sale.

After 18 months of fundraising, numerous days of preparation camps, and 34 hours in the air, the long awaited World Scout Jamboree in Japan has been and gone. It held many wonderful and wacky experiences we could not have imagined, and the greatest of these was the immeasurable, lasting impact it would have on ourselves. From the first selection camp we heard 'life changing', but the weight of this claim was never truly understood until we were plunged into the first-hand experience, and it exceeded all lofty expectations.



Pope urges all religious communities to help refugees

Pope Francis said the Vatican would extend help to two families who will be taken in by Vatican parishes. In front of thousands of people in St Peter's Square, he added that it was not enough to simply encourage the refugees with calls for courage and patience.

Instead, he suggested, tangible demonstrations of help were required: 'May every parish, every religious community, every monastery, every sanctuary of Europe, take in one family'.

Even as we took off on our six thousand mile journey, we had already overcome a sizeable challenge: bonding with a group consisting of mostly complete strangers; eighteen Cumbrian scouts, nine girl guides from Merseyside and nine scouts from Botswana, tied together only by the solidarity of the Scout Movement. To my knowledge, we were the only UK unit with such a varied demographic. It almost feels strange to mention this at all, as we became such a tightly knit group that those first meetings and online communications seem a world away. An early lesson from the Jamboree was the value of solid friendships from sometimes just across the county, as well as the world...

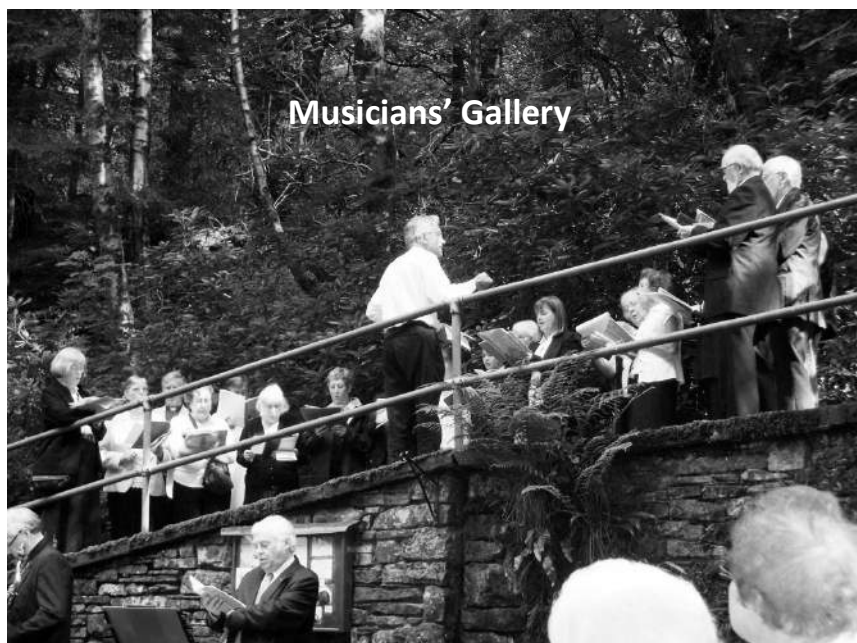

90 people from 11 parishes - and including some visitors to the area - came to this unusual service on August 30th. The choir of 20 voices, led by David Jones and accompanied by Bill Lawler, opened the service with John Rutter's lively setting of "All Things Bright and Beautiful".

Worshippers may have been uncertain what to expect with the "multi-sensory" elements of the service. But all found the five sections - covering Touch, Sight, Sound, Smell and Taste - stimulating and sometimes moving.

Five different people led these sections. Recorded sound-effects evoked laughter and memories; we thought of smells in the life of Jesus, from the incense presented by one of the Wise Men, to the smell of fish which accompanied the calling of the disciples; we pondered the things we value seeing, from the beauty of the trees to the faces of our friends; the ways touch can express love and healing; and the rich variety of tastes that have been involved in worship - from roast lamb at Passover to wine at the Last Supper.

As we moved out from the Lodge Howe Room at the hotel to go out to the Well, we were invited to experience smells of incense, mint, and creosote; to taste things salty and sweet, sour and bitter - crisps, smarties, olives and pickle; and the choir sang Vaughan Williams' motet, "O taste and see how gracious the Lord is."

The service concluded with Communion in the open air by the Well led by Rev. Beverley Lock, and the presentation of

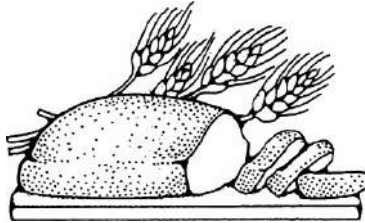
