Church Letter

From Fran Parkinson

About a year ago I was invited to be part of a steering group set up specifically to discuss plans for a Diocesan mission in March 2018, what is now known as Moving Mountains. I don't know what comes into your mind when you hear that phrase, but I'm always reminded of Jesus' words that faith as small as a mustard seed can move mountains. (Matthew 17.20) For the Jews who believed that the roots of a mountain went right down into the earth, this was a grand claim, and perhaps there are those who feel that the idea of a mission is a grand claim too, so please allow me to explore the idea a little further.

As an ecumenical event, the vision of Moving Mountains has always been to bring our churches together in a weekend of exciting activities with the purpose of 'revealing God's love for all'. There are no rules about how we do this, but it requires a certain amount of faith from all of us, not least to begin to think about what that might look like in our local setting.

And the truth is, many of us are already involved in mission, in the myriad ways that we connect with our friends and neighbours, host community events, raise money for local causes, and create church spaces which are hospitable and welcoming.

Moving Mountains is an opportunity for us to focus these efforts over a period of three days, and with assistance from a visiting team and with various Diocesan resources, to create a momentum that will hopefully last long after the weekend is over!

I was inspired by a recent visit to Durham Diocese who had their mission, 'Talking Jesus' in March this year. Their local churches had put together a great programme, with items ranging from coffee and cake in the church hall; 'Grill a Bishop' in the

pub; a meal for couples who had been married in church; right through to a huge flash mob in the Metro Centre involving the Archbishop of York! There was a real buzz among all those involved and it brought different congregations and leaders together in a united purpose.

My personal favourite was the Q & A session held for a group of Bell Ringers which was aptly named a 'Ding Dong!' It was a simple social event which connected church and community together in a discussion about issues of faith and proved that mission isn't about 'preaching the gospel' but rather reaching out in the love of God.

As part of a visiting team I was involved in a Remembering Service where families were invited by the church to come and light a candle in memory of those who had died within the last couple of years. It was obviously a very moving event, but also a reminder to those who came that the church continues to care for them, especially in the difficult seasons of life.

I was reminded recently that mission is, and always has been, God's idea, seen most clearly in the incarnation. Jesus didn't exactly move mountains, but he did cross the divide between earth and heaven in order to reveal God's love for us and, as the church, we are partners with him in that mission.

So we have 7 months in which to think, pray and plan. We also have a joint meeting at 7.30pm on Wednesday, September 13th at St Michael's Church in Shap, to share thoughts and ideas. But most of all, Moving Mountains is an invitation to revisit what it means for us as individuals to know the love of God and how we share that with others. As Pope Francis once said, "anyone who has experienced God's love doesn't need much training to be a missionary!"

This has been the busiest time for some time, birdwise, in this corner of Tebay

It will be back to school soon for the youngsters. I met a family in Sedbergh who were up here on holiday. They were camping and had got pretty wet but were having a great time despite this. Kendal Calling had a muddy experience but a good time was had by all despite the weather. I was able to get to the 106 bus coffee morning in Shap and despite a very wet walk to the Hall a great number of people was there. Over £1,000 was raised which was a great encouragement. It surprises me that so few people use the buses which are so convenient as there are no worries about parking in Kendal or Penrith. Notes from the Herald, August, 1917

Fine, warm, slowly cooling with light rain on most days. Thundery rain from 23rd damaging the harvest (vital in this war).

Orton The RDC at Kirkby Stephen is thinking of connecting the eight houses at Raine, short of water, to Tebay's main. Adjourned till September. Died in a Canadian quarry on 30th June, Mr. John Story, 42. He gave on groan and collapsed in front of his 11 year old son. He was born in Orton and married a daughter of Mr. And Mrs. D.S. Machell, Old Tebay. A joiner apprenticed in Orton, he began his own firm in Brough then emigrated to Fusilier in Saskatchewan. Another Orton joiner died – a P.o.W. in Germany. Private T. Bradberry, Stennersheugh. He was ill and died on 11th May. Missing since 10th July, Lance Corporal W. Wilson of the Fleece Inn, Orton, enlisted in August 1914. Slain on 18th November 1916 but news only reached his sister at Holes Farm in late August – Private A.B. Cowperthwaite. Died at Orton at Fair View on Monday, 20th, Mr. John Stephenson who was 81 and had been ill. A pillar of Orton Primitive Methodist Church as was his father. A joiner, wheelwright and steam-sawyer he was kindly. A teetotaler he helped get the Temperance Hall built. A few years ago he bought an oak tree growing near Orton to make his coffin from. This was done. Mr. J. Robertson (Orton) was the undertaker; his staff had included John Story (see above).

Tebay Slain, aged 20, Private George Ward only son of Mr. John Ward who emigrated from Tebay to Kitscoty, Alberta in 1907. In Tebay he was signalman for 15 years and ran the Liberal Association there. Pte. George was in the Canadian Army (report 11th August)

Ravenstonedale Leave permitting Mr. Anthony, only son of the late Mr. And Mrs. Metcalfe-Gibson, Coldbeck, will marry Miss Doris M. Only daughter of the late Mr. W.H. and Mrs. Thwaytes, Holesfoot Lodge, Crosby Ravensworth, very quietly on Wednesday, 15th at 2pm. Both deceased fathers were J.Ps. Sgt. J.W. Guy has been in hospital; is now M.M. (Military Medal). Presentation to him in the Public Room on Monday 6th, by Mr. T.A. Metcalfe-Gibson of a wristlet watch and £11.10s. in notes (now £920). Slain, Private T. Bradberry (see above) buried in the Cemetery of Honour in Aachen.

(1)50 years ago - Died of blood poisoning from too tight new boots for his outing to Manchester on 5th August, Mr. John Fawcett, tailor and draper of Ravenstonedale, age not given.

1917 The Government cut the cost of meat by 3d lb in late August. It is now buying up local cattle for feeding the Army.

Joke Farmer: National Insurance for my housekeeper? Tha's too late, lad – I've wed her!

Notes from The Herald, September, 1917

Cloudy first week, fine warm second week, stormy on 20th then mixed, cooler. Tuesday, 4th was the warmest, 69F. Harvesting and haymaking.

Orton and Tebay have a Food Control sub-committee, one of N. Westmorland's three. Began on 3rd. Apply now for your Sugar Card. Not yet to hand but needs to be sent for. (No card, no sugar). Died Sat. 1st September in Windermere aged ninety three and three quarters, Mr. William Joel of Tebay, farmer at Barugh, Tebay, Bretherdale and near Sedbergh. Retired to Sedbergh 20 years ago and to Tebay in 1908. In 1848 he married Ruth, daughter of Mr. William Jackson, Low Lane, Tebay. Diamond Wedding was 22nd April, 1908. She died on 18th August, 1914. Six of their seven children survive. His funeral was at Orton Church on 5th September.

Slain in France, Corporal Robert Horsfall of the Military Mounted Police, 16th Irish Regt. He was the eldest son of Mr. Robert Horsfall of Orton. Cpl. Horsfall was to be DCM but fell before it could be given to him; before he enlisted he was in the Westmorland Police at Bowness. (Report on 1st September doesn't say when he enlisted or when he fell). Also slain in France by a shell – he died at once – Private Joseph K. Taylor, son of Mr. E. Taylor, Howe Nook, Orton. He was 26. His friend Private Stobar (Cumrew) wrote to his father, as did his Lieutenant. Joseph "a very cheerful lad, always full of hope, arrived at the Front on 3rd and died on 5th. (Report 29th September).

Tebay To let, in Tebay, Overclue Gill Farm – house and 30 acres – and unlimited right on Tebay Common adjoining. Is about one and a quarter miles from Tebay Station – Richard Sharp, 19 South Road, Kirkby Stephen is owner.

Ravenstonedale Congregational Church Harvest Festival Sunday, 16th, Tea Monday 17th.

Ravenstonedale Endowed School has collected £2-7-0d (now £188) for Dr. Barnardo's Homes.

Newbiggin-on-Lune Church's Harvest Festival on Friday 14th was preceded by a Primitive Methodist Rally outside its gates. On Sunday 16th the Vicar of Brough led the Harvest Service in Newbiggin on Lune Church.

Prices at Penrith, late September 1917.

Flour 9d per stone cheaper, at 2s8d; Oatmeal 1s0d per stone cheaper at 4s6d (1stone = 14lbs; 1lb = 454grams). Meat is 1d lb cheaper at 1s5d. The Government has capped and cut these prices.

Orton Memorials Book

Received from the printer this week were copies of the All Saints' Church, Orton, Memorials book. This substantial volume contains some 750 full colour pictures, and where possible the transcribed inscriptions, of every single memorial stone inside and outside the church - a total of 250 pages with three grave stones per page. In addition there is a 35-page alphabetical index of every name that appears on any memorial, and a user-friendly plan to show exactly where to locate any particular memorial stone.

The book was compiled - with many, many hours of labour - by Heather Ballantyne, of the Orton and Tebay Local History Society, with some assistance from me; and it was supported by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Sustainable Development Fund.

A copy of the book will be available in church for anyone wishing to research their ancestors or to find a particular grave. Other copies will be in the Kendal Archives, at Diocesan Church House, and elsewhere, as well as some privately purchased copies.

treefold:east completed near Little Asby

(See front cover of *The Link*)

Anyone who has passed Sunbiggin Tarn and the stump of the Dowly Tree in recent weeks will have seen a new landmark taking shape. **treefold:east** is one of three dry stone wall structures being constructed across Cumbria. It has been devised and designed by Kendal-based artists, Rob and Harriet Fraser.



"The site of **treefold:east** has been chosen for its proximity to the hawthorn but also because there has been a tree near this location for centuries, known locally as the Dowly Tree," said Rob.

"There is now only a stump but it has been a waymarker and a landmark in the past. **treefold:east** will surround and protect a new tree, to be planted in the winter."

This is a crossing point, or a meeting point, between many places: Little Asby, Soulby, Crosby Garrett, Orton, Kelleth, Newbiggin, Ravenstonedale, Sunbiggin and other hamlets and villages, small settlements whose intersections converge here."

The treefold incorporates lines of a poem, written by Harriet and carved into the stones by Dentdale stone letter carver, Pip Hall.

The poem reads:

*in this circle of land's bones
moments gather into wood*

The poem continues in the second structure, **treefold:centre**, which is in Grizedale Forest, and it will be completed when the third and final structure, **treefold:west** is built in Wasdale in September. A tree will be planted in each of the treefolds later in the year at the best time for saplings to take root.

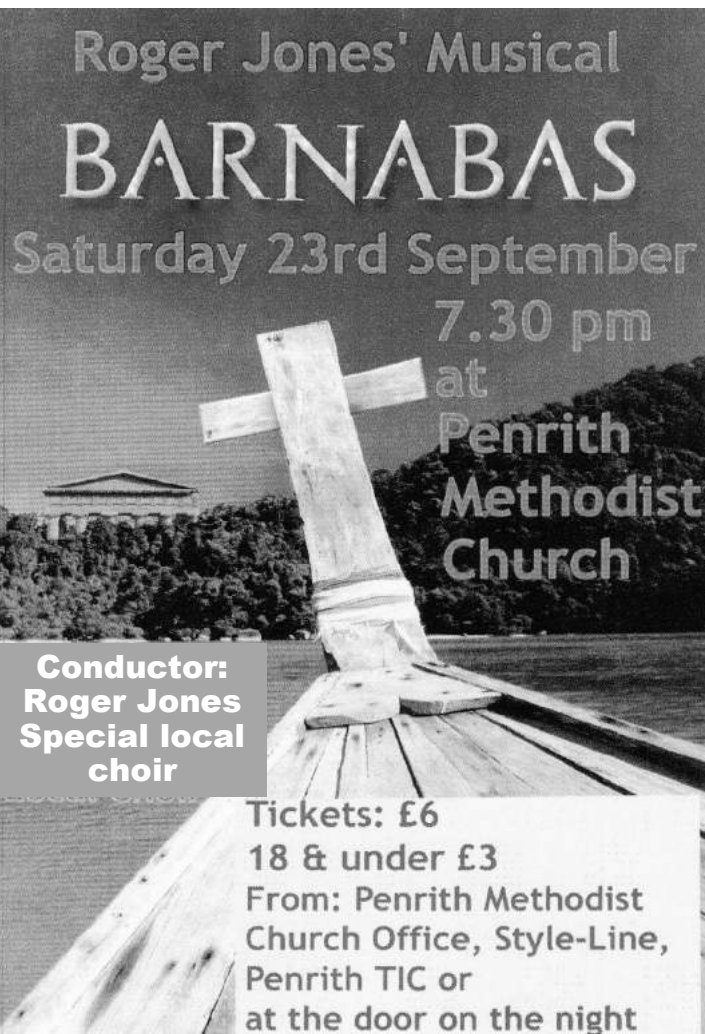

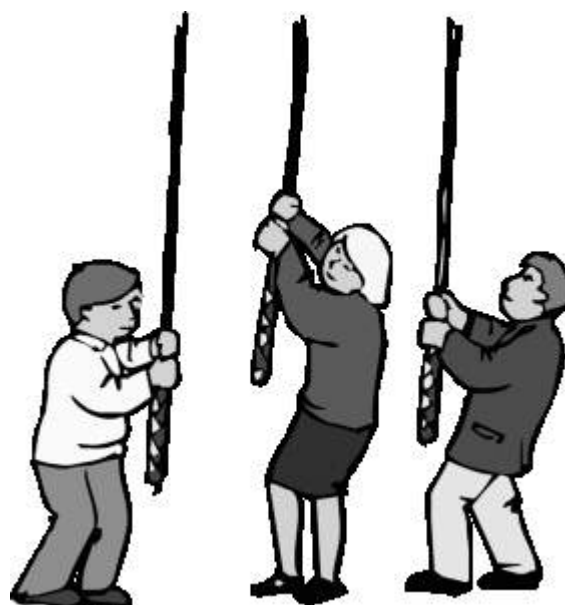

Vandalism to National Park Sign



Unfortunately one of the recently installed National Park signs close to the village of Orton has been sprayed with paint, and also struck, possibly with a hammer. Many in the village have expressed dismay that this mindless act has occurred, and the issue was discussed at the most recent Parish Council meeting. The action was roundly condemned, and the Parish Council has now arranged the cleaning of the sign.

It is particularly disappointing that this has happened as the Park Authority has gone to great lengths to recognise that our area has some characteristics which differ from the rest of the original Park. The recently installed signs are the only ones within the Park not to have "Yorkshire Dales National Park" as the main sign. The "Westmorland Dales" wording recognises that the extension is in the east ward of Westmorland – the ancient county many of us remember with affection.

There are also many "Dales" in the parishes – Lunesdale, Ravenstonedale, Bowderdale, Longdale, Bretherdale, to name but a few. The integration of our area into the Park has to date been harmonious and to the considerable benefit of our communities. It is to be hoped that such incidents do not occur again.

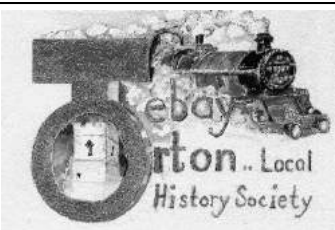

All Saints' Church Tower

There has been a long standing problem with the tower of All Saints' church letting water in. It is believed that the tower had been lime rendered in the past and this was removed by the Victorians. Since then various treatments have been applied to try and solve the problem including using silicone. All these failed so at the beginning of this century a restoration project to render the tower was drawn up and completed in 2006. This scheme was successful in spite of some of the render failing on the west elevation.

We were informed at the time that it would need re-lime washing about every ten years. Last year a scheme was drawn up to remove the remaining defective render from the west wall, re-render this and re-lime wash all four elevations. We started the project this spring and the west wall has been completed. However when the specialist lime plasterers started to lime wash the north and south elevations they discovered a problem with the lime wash not soaking in as it should. This is in part due to the silicone still being present in places and a problem with the original lime render. It has therefore been decided to re-render the other three walls before applying the lime wash. There may not be enough time this year to complete the other three walls and we are therefore re-rendering and lime washing the south wall and may leave the north and east sides until next year. The scaffolding is scheduled to be removed early next month.



Biblical Names

An occasional series by Christopher Jenkin

Names go in fashions, and in recent years parents have started to call their children by names which are found in the Bible – though they are not always aware of that, nor of who the Bible character was.

Adam: This was the name given to the first created human being. In fact the name “Adam” means “mankind”; the very first mention is in Genesis 1:26: “And God said, ‘Let us make man (*Hebrew: ‘ADAM’*) in our image, in our likeness.” Sometimes the definite article is added, meaning “the man”. But in other verses it is simply “Adam”, as a name. The word is also related to the word “adamah”, meaning “ground” – significant in Genesis 2:7: “The Lord God formed the man from the dust of the ground”. There is rich meaning and significance in these early stories of the creation of mankind. The Sumerian and Babylonian myths of the creation of man are known, but compared with the creation story in the Bible all are crude and polytheistic. Briefly we may notice three points: (a) Adam, Mankind, is made in the image of God – i.e. sharing God’s nature and capable of a relationship with God, in a way quite different from animal life. (b) The image of his being moulded from the dust of the ground both indicates that we are a part of this planet, with the same atomic and molecular structure, but it can also be interpreted as a poetic way of expressing the scientific theory of evolution of mankind from primitive slime. (c) The Adam story places mankind in a garden – i.e. not at the hunter-gatherer, earlier stage of human development, but at the stage of horticulture and agriculture.

More Notes from Jeremy Godwin

Further to my remarks in the Link, July/August 2017 on Mary, the Hebrew word for “bitter” – And why should “bitter” be a daughter’s name? Probably because the parents had hoped for a son. A daughter was a bitter blow if they were hard up as they would have to pay out her dowry if she hoped to marry. Women were second-class or lower in the social scale (but not in Jesus’ estimation. He put them on equal footing with the male disciples.)

Derivations in Young’s Concordance:

Abel – “Transience, i.e. of short life. As a place name Abel means “grassy”, suitable for a shepherd.

Cain – “Greed, Acquisitiveness”.

Friends of Tarn Gill Bridge, Ravenstonedale

We are continuing to make progress in our aim of conserving the bridge, albeit slowly. Martin Elson, Cumbria County Council's Bridge Engineer, has finally agreed that an investigation of the north-east abutment foundation may go ahead, subject to the necessary written permissions being granted by the Council. The Council however will not pay for this work, so the Friends have agreed to do so, with money in hand from previous fund-raising efforts.

Meanwhile the Friends have followed up the suggestion made by Julie Martin, the current Heritage Champion from the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, when she visited the bridge, that the self-seeded trees which obscure the views of the bridge from upstream and downstream should be removed. This will restore a view of the bridge similar to the one in the Friends logo. Verbal permission for the work has been given by Geoff Garrett, Senior Trees and Woodland Officer, YDNP, and as soon as our contractor receives written confirmation, then the work will go ahead. This work will be funded by an anonymous donation from within the Friends.

The Friends Committee has decided to apply to Historic England for the bridge to be recommended for listing by the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport as an asset of historical and/or architectural interest. Historic England has confirmed that the bridge has never been considered for designation before, so the Secretary of the Friends is now slowly navigating the Historic England online form to request that it be considered.

Finally, during the research for this designation application, we have discovered a reference to the bridge as "Ford Bridge". Has anyone ever come across this name being used before? It would help us to know if it was in widespread use in the village before the bridge came to be known as "Chantry Bridge" – which presumably happened after The Chantry was built for John Carver in 1896. There is a postcard of the bridge dating from the 1950's captioned "Chantry Bridge".

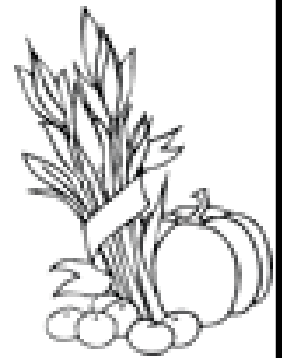

Ravenstonedale Village Gardens Opening 1st & 2nd July, 2017

'What on earth is happening?' said the couple as they arrived at their B&B in Ravenstonedale, for the latest of many visits to a place they love for its hidden-away, quiet charm. Yet today, they were greeted by scores of people wandering up and down the High Street and all around the village. It was the Village Gardens Open Day, as part of the National Gardens Scheme (NGS).



The Chantry Garden

Four gardens were open. At the top of the village, The Chantry garden (John & Joan Houston) is loosely divided into areas of different styles, including herbaceous borders spilling over the paths around the house, a formal raised pond surrounded by ferns and hostas, and a large wildlife pond with grasses and a

bog garden. The garden of High Chapel House (Dave & Jackie Wedd) is 'in progress', with development very much devoted to wildlife. A small exhibition detailed the large number of birds and butterflies which have been seen in the garden – not to mention the swallows nesting in an outhouse, and the red squirrels. Wyegarth Rigg (Sue Richardson) showed how much can be achieved in a small space, in a short period of time, with varied planting, a wildlife pond, a number of different seating areas and a woodland area, already well established less than a year after planting. In contrast, the village allotments offered a glimpse of the different practical approaches to growing a range of produce in the short season which the less than ideal conditions provide.

Just outside the village, the stone-walled garden at Low Thackthwaite (David & Vivien Caldow) includes varied flower beds, a sunken patio and a fish pond with beck running through, all surrounded by the magnificent Howgill fells. A number of visitors, with possible purchases at the plant sale in mind, chose to drive there, but quite a number enjoyed the short walk along the lane, or the longer circular walk through Paradise. Another walking option was to Kilnmore, where there was a guided

tour of the hay meadows each day.

But you can't have garden visiting without teas so visitors also made the short walk to the Heritage Centre, either down the main street or via the footpath over the fields, which gave them an 'over the wall' view of the wonderful combination of local materials and craftsmanship with modern design - epitomised by the moongate - in the garden of Fallowfield (John & Rose Nicholson). At the Heritage Centre, the array of scones and cakes would have impressed Mary Berry (who happens to be President of NGS). While there, visitors could study a photographic exhibition of village gardens, past and present.

The opening attracted nearly 350 visitors over the weekend. All seemed to enjoy the very different gardens which were open, the teas (of course!) and the village itself. Some were keen and/or knowledgeable gardeners, while others just fancied a nice day out. Some came from no further than the other end of the village, having seen the posters put up locally. Others came from more distant parts of Cumbria, Lancashire, Yorkshire and Scotland, having found the details in the NGS 'yellow book' or on its website.



High Chapel House Garden

The National Gardens Scheme celebrates its 90th year this year. It was originally part of the Queen's Nursing Institute, and in its first year, 1927, 600 private gardens opened to the public and raised £8000 at 'one shilling a head'. Today, 3,700 gardens open throughout the country, raising funds predominantly for nursing charities – MacMillan, Marie Curie, Hospice UK, Carers Trust, Queens' Nursing Institute. For most of these, NGS is the largest cumulative donor in their histories. In total, £50 million has been raised, £25 million in the last ten years.

The Ravenstonedale Village Gardens Opening raised £2355, and with additional funds raised from

privately arranged visits to The Chantry garden, a total of £2600 was sent to NGS. The Heritage Centre, also received £337 as its share of the income from the teas. Huge thanks are due, not only to the garden owners, but to all whose hard work contributed to the event's great success – John Pratt for his hay meadow walks, the Local History Society for putting the exhibition together, Helen Shields for organising the teas, and the army of local ladies who baked, served or most crucially, washed up. Finally, thanks to those of you who visited, and helped us support these very well-deserving charities.

Would we do it again? It was hard work but it was extremely enjoyable, sharing our gardens with lovely people. So, yes, we will do it again, but not until 2019, to give us a bit of a rest, and a chance to develop our gardens further. Hopefully also, to expand the number of gardens opening, to make the event (even) more attractive to visitors. If you think you might be interested in being involved, please contact me.

1. Thinking about Prayer

(45 pages: £4.00)

In this short book the author looks at some of the issues faced by people who feel they ought to pray but sometimes find it hard. What is prayer, anyway? Are there different kinds of prayer that I should try? Should I expect God to answer in some way that I can recognise? But what if he doesn't?

Using Bible teaching as well as stories from his own years of experience as a Christian minister, the author faces these questions squarely and honestly. Most readers will find his answers both readable and helpful.

2. What on earth is the Church?

(72 pages: £4.50)

In a period when traditional images of the church are being stretched to breaking point, because of diminishing numbers of clergy and increasing financial stringency, the author suggests that a fresh examination of the church of the New Testament may show us a way forward for the church of the 21st century.

Since this book (based on a course of talks given in High Westmorland churches two years ago) was first produced, an extra chapter has been added: **What on earth is the Church for?**

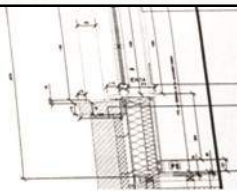
